Pipeline Right-of-Way Lease
ADL 413342**

On May 8, 1987, an application was accepted under provisions of AS 38.35, the Right-of-Way Leasing Act, with the Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources, Pruch M. Juaneu, Alaska 99811, for a Right-of-Way Lease ADL 413342 for the Trans Alaska Gas (TAGS) Pipeline.

Applicants

The Yukon Pacific Corporation, P.O. Box 101700, Anchorage, Alaska 99510, has filed an application for the Right-of-Way Lease for the proposed natural gas pipeline.

**General Description
of Lands Involved**

The proposed route being approximately 798.5 miles in length and 100 feet in width during the construction phase generally parallels the existing TAPS oil pipeline with deviations in the vicinity of Prudhoe Bay, south of Franklin Bluffs west of TAPS Pump Station 2; west of Pump Station 3; west of Galbraith Lake; north of Fairbanks in the vicinity of Fox and south of Fairbanks in the vicinity of Moose Creek; west of Summit Lake; east of Stordough; south of Copper Center between Stuck Mountain and Willow Mountain, and Thompson Pass. The proposed route commences at Prudhoe Bay in the BE14 Section 11, T. 11, N., R. 14 E., Umiat Meridian. Thence in a southerly direction to Anderson Bay 3 miles west of the TAPS terminal on the south shore of Port Valdez in the NW14 Section 20, T. 9 S., R. 7 W., Copper River Meridian, Alaska.

**Summary of the Substance
of the Application**

The proposed route of the pipeline Right-of-Way Lease is requested to provide an area to construct

a 28 inch outside diameter welded steel pipeline designed to transport 2.3 billion cubic feet (BCF) per day of conditioned natural gas from Prudhoe Bay to Anderson Bay, Port of Valdez. The pipeline will be buried over the entire route except at certain river crossings and at certain built crossings. The proposed Right-of-Way during construction phase is 100 feet and the permanent pipeline Right-of-Way will be 53 feet wide. The Right-of-Way is proposed to facilitate construction of the pipeline as well as operation, maintenance, repair, and replacement if necessary and to construct and operate the related facilities such as compressor stations, access roads, and surveillance and monitoring of the pipeline.

The application states that ten compressor stations will be required to maintain necessary pressure for gas transportation along the proposed route and the pipeline is proposed under chilled conditions.

The pipeline will be buried in an excavated and backfilled ditch. Pipeline depth of cover is determined by federal regulations in populated areas. Final pipeline ditch design will be based on site specific soil conditions, at road crossings, or in other situations. Ditch backfilled material must meet certain requirements to provide resistance to pipe flotation and not be subject to hydraulic or thermal erosion, and not damage the pipe coating system. Excavated soils that meet these requirements will be used for backfill. Otherwise, imported granular material will be placed around the pipe to a depth of 12 inches from the top of the pipe and excavated soil will be mounded over the granular material.

Construction camps for TAGS pipeline will generally be located at former TAPS construction camp sites and also be located at the site of each compressor station. A liquid natural gas (LNG) plant and marine terminal are proposed at Anderson Bay. Two LNG tanker berths are proposed for mooring and loading of LNG tankers.

Minimal damage or harm to vegetation will occur in the right-of-way area and would be limited to the immediate vicinity of the pipeline and construction/maintenance road. All areas disturbed by construction, maintenance, operation and termination will be reclaimed.


Proposed commencement for construction of the gas pipeline is 1990, with an estimated construction time of five years. Approximate number of persons to be employed at peak of construction is 10,300, averaging 6,350. The approximate number of persons to be employed to operate and maintain the pipeline would be 580.

Public hearings on the right-of-way lease application will be set at a future date. The State Department of Natural Resources will furnish at cost copies of the application to persons requesting them.
