

# DINYEIA

The Dinyea Corporation of Stevens Village announces that their offices have moved to 208 Wendell Street, Room 202, Fairbanks, Alaska.

Gene George, president of the corporation said that Greg Thies was terminated as manager of the Corporation as of March 20, 1975, by board resolution.

One of the main reasons for his termination was due to the fact that the village corporation is allowed only 7 per cent of the interest that the village earns on the money that is kept in trust by the regional corporation, Doyon Limited.

That means for the next 12 months the Dinyea Corporation must continue to operate an office and administer business for the corporation with a budget that allows for only 15,000 dollars. Doyon Limited board of directors has a set of guidelines that the village corporation must go by in order to obtain funds for operational and administrative budgets.

If the villages submit any proposal that exceeds the 7 per cent then they must go before the board of director of Doyon for funding.

According to Gene George, the Dinyea Corporation has in the past gone to the regional corporation but was unsuccessful in obtaining funds for larger budgets.

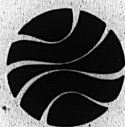

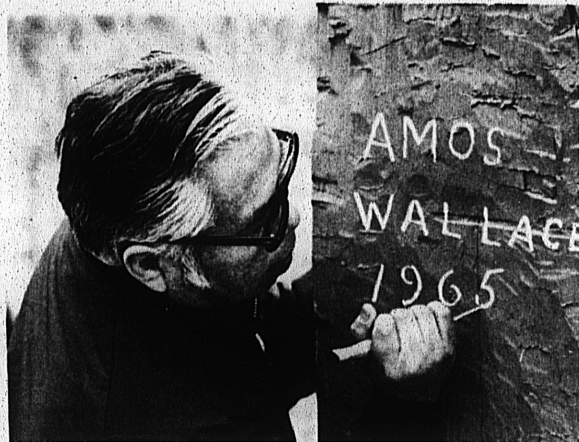

### SPECIAL NOTICE FROM THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF LABOR

DUE TO THE CURRENT HIGH RATE OF UNEMPLOYMENT, THE FOLLOWING SPECIAL PROGRAMS HAVE BEEN PUT IN EFFECT TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE UNEMPLOYED.

#### SPECIAL UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE (SUA)

This program provides unemployment compensation to individuals who have worked in jobs not covered by the regular unemployment insurance program. Funds are provided by the federal government. (SUA effective December 22, 1974)

#### EXTENDED BENEFITS (EB)

This program provides additional benefits to persons who have exhausted their regular unemployment benefits, or who have an expired benefit year (expired after January 18, 1975) and have not earned enough wages to qualify for regular benefits. EB, when added to regular benefits, provides up to 39 weeks entitlement. EB costs are shared by the State and Federal governments. (EB effective January 19, 1975)

#### FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL BENEFITS (FSB)

This program provides additional benefits to persons who have exhausted EB entitlement. FSB, when added to regular and EB benefits, provides up to 52 weeks entitlement. FSB funds are provided by the Federal government. (FSB effective January 19, 1975)
