

To Work for NANA— 'Top Cop' Carr

FORT RICHARDSON, Ak. Oct. 30 — The U. S. Army, Alaska's "Top Cop" retired today at a ceremony in his honor in the office of the commanding general.

At the ceremony concluding more than 34 years service in U. S. Army, Colonel Bernard E. Carr received the Legion of Merit from Major General S. M. Marks, commander, U.S. Army, Alaska.

Replacing Colonel Carr is Major Ronald H. Sperber, who served previously as Provost Marshal at Ft. Wainwright, Ak.

Colonel Carr, 51, who has been assigned as the U.S. Army Alaska, Provost Marshal since

July 1971, enlisted in the Michigan National Guard in 1940 while still attending Lansing Central High School, Lansing, Mich.

After graduation he attended basic training at Ft. Leonard Wood, Mo., in 1941, and was graduated from the Field Artillery Officer Candidate School in 1943. World War II combat service with parachute field artillery units in Europe followed.

Colonel Carr graduated from Michigan State College, East Lansing, Mich., in 1949, with a bachelor of science degree in police science. Following college he spent the next 25 years in airborne and military police assignments.

He has served as the Provost Marshal at Ft. Wainwright, Alaska; for the 101st Airborne Division at Ft. Campbell, Ky., and in Vietnam; at Ft. Dix, N. J.; and currently at USARL, Ft. Richardson, Alaska.

With two tours of duty in Europe and Alaska and with assignments in Korea, Japan and Vietnam, Colonel Carr has served nearly sixteen and one half years overseas. Stateside he has served twice at Fort Bragg, N.C., and Sheridan, Ill., and one tour of duty at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo.; Gordon, Ga.; Campbell, Ky. and Dix, N.J.

In addition to the Legion of Merit, Colonel Carr's awards and decorations include the Bronze Star Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Commendation Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, the Air Medal, and numerous overseas, combat and service ribbons.

The colonel and his wife, Harriet, have four children: a son David, 25, who graduated from the U. S. Military Academy in 1970 and is now an Army captain assigned to the 3rd Infantry (Old Guard), Ft. Myer, Va; a daughter, Susan, 24, a graduate of Radford College, Radford, Va, who is now teaching school in Hampton, Va.; and two sons, Pete, 17, and Mark, 14, a senior and freshman, respectively, at Bartlett-Begich High School.

The entire family hunts, fishes and skis. Mrs. Carr is active in the Ft. Richardson Officer's Wives Club and in the Army Community Services Program. The colonel has been awarded a Black Belt in Judo.

He is a Mason, a member of the Chugach Rod and Gun Club, Alaska Peace Officers Assoc., International Association of Chiefs of Police, and the American Society for Industrial Security.

Colonel Carr will be employed by the Northwest Area Native Association (NANA) as security Supervisor for pipeline security, north of the Yukon River.

Ruth, always doing all she can to better the Inter-Cultural Relations between the many people of these United States, and the world; has this year a Hawaiian and Eskimo theme for the show. The understanding generated by these shows, Howard, is of great value in itself. Added to that is assistance to those now unable to help themselves anymore because of great age.

Howard, Ruth and I are not asking for money. We are asking our people for aid in the form of Eskimo handicraft on a loan basis.

Dear friend, even an old pair of mukluks with the grass still in them would be more than welcome. Ruth can be reached at the following address: Exec. Building, Suite 102B, 1135 Pasadena Avenue South, South Pasadena, Fla. 33707.

I believe this is the southernmost Eskimo outpost in the United States. For people who live on the coast, Lena Andree at Dillingham is helping Ruth. All items will be returned.

In closing Howard, I must thank you for the Tundra Times commendation of Lena Andree on her work with Alcohol & Drug Abuse. My own life is a good example for the need of these programs. Even our Great Chief Attungowruk, fell victim to alcohol addiction and paid with his life. I cannot compare myself to that fine man, but with the exception of a common foe, alcohol.

It's my hope that someday a Rehabilitation Center will be raised and named after him. It would be a fitting tribute that so great a spirit should return in such a form...
