

3-week session at UAF targets northern people

FAIRBANKS — Human adaptation to the North will be the subject of the University of Alaska Fairbanks Institute of Circumpolar Studies, a three-week session of presentations and directed research on the UAF campus starting July 31.

This year's institute begins with a 10-day conference called "Peoples of the Circumpolar North." The conference includes lectures, seminars and field trips, all focusing on the peoples of the North, their histories and environments.

The conference will be followed by an optional nine days of directed research, in which students may follow up on topics of special interest.

One hour of graduate credit is available for participation in the first conference. An additional two hours will be awarded for successful completion of the directed research.
