# 3 Premiers for TV

FAIRBANKS — Premiers for three television programs produced for the ATS-6 satellite project at the University of Alaska, Fairbanks are scheduled for some time in October. Project Manager Paul Hartman said the programs had been scheduled for the week of Sept. 23-30, but were delayed due to problems with the ATS-6 satellite being used in the project.

The programs will be aired in more than a dozen communities throughout the state via the ATS-6 satellite in orbit over the equator.

The programs, "Amy and the Astros," dealing with basic oral language development, "Right On!" dealing with health education, and the "Alaska Native

Magazine," a "viewer defined" program, were produced almost entirely in the State of Alaska.

The series which will last 31 weeks, has cost more than \$500,000 to produce and broadcast.

In Southeastern Alaska the programs will be aired at the following times (Pacific Daylight Time): "Right On!", Monday and Friday, 12:30-1 p.m.; "Amy and the Astros," Monday and Friday, 1-1:30 p.m.; and the "Alaska Native Magazine," Tuesday 9-10 p.m.

In the rest of the series' viewing area the programs will be seen as follows (Alaska Daylight Time): "Right On!", Monday and Friday, 10:30-11 a.m.; "Amy and the Astros," Monday and Friday, 11-11:30 a.m.; and "Alaska Native Magazine," Tuesday, 7-8 p.m.

In Fairbanks the series will be aired on Channel 9; in Anchorage it will be received at the Alaska Native Health Center; and in most other communities it will be carried on television sets in the community schools.

The "Alaska Native Magazine" is aimed at adult viewers, while the other two program series are aimed at public school students in the communities.
