If found guilty, a judge may be suspended, removed from office, retired or censored by the State Supreme Court upon the recommendation of the members of the commission.

He was born and raised in Ketchikan and holds a Degree in Zoology from Oregon State University and a Degree in Education from Western Washington State University. He also attended Graduate School at the University of New Mexico where he studied in the Masters of Business and Administration Program.

He is also the past president of the Anchorage Native Caucus, past president of the Tsimshian Tribal Association and a former board member of SeaAlaska Corporation.
