All Alaska federal Indian tribes and traditional tribal councils are being cordially invited to a statewide tribal organizational meeting to be held in Anchorage May 5-6, 1983. The meetings will take place at the University of Alaska-Anchorage Consortium Library Building from 9 a.m. - 10 p.m. each day. The meetings will consist mainly of work sessions, with a general session being held the afternoon of the second day.

This format is to allow tribal representatives maximum input of development of policy for the organization, according to officials of the Interim Statewide Tribal Organization Committee.
