Anchorage Daily News Comes Out For John Rader for U.S. House

The Anchorage Daily News in its morning edition this week endorsed the candidacy of John Rader for the Democratic nomination for the United States House of Representatives.

The news editorial said, "Alaska is allotted only one of the 435 seats in the U.S. House of Representatives. Far from rendering our decision trivial, this circumstance demands that Alaska select a representative of unusual ability, resource, and just plain common sense."

"We believe that among the four Democrats seeking nomination, John Rader, is the outstanding candidate," the News said.

Explaining its editorial position the paper said, "First Rader has strongly gone on record in drawing the line between courting presidential favor and guarding congressional prerogatives."

He has assailed Pollock for ceding congressional budgetary authority to the White House in passing the responsibility for cutting \$6 billion from the budget to the President.

The Pollock type of approach, shared by many other members of Congress, has already resulted in grievous loss of needed federal monies to

Alaska."

The Anchorage Daily News also cited Rader's stand on Vietnam as a reason for its endorsement.

"John Rader has taken a consistent position against escalation of the horrendous slaughter now being waged in the name of 'democracy' in southeast Asia. Nick Begich has spoken on all sides of this issue, although he appears to be in basic accord with the policies of the Johnson administration."

PROPOSALS SOLICITED FOR
CHANGES IN 1969 FISH AND
GAME REGULATIONS

The Department of Fish and Game announces that proposals for specific changes in the regulations for commercial fishing, sport fishing, and brown grizzly bears are now being solicited. Such proposals must be received by the Department of Fish and Game, Support Building, Juneau, Alaska 99801, no later than 5:00 PM, October 4, 1968, in order to be considered by the Board of Fish and Game at its fall meeting.

The fall meeting will be concerned primarily with changes in the commercial and sport fishing regulations; however, for the first time the Board will consider changes in game regulations dealing with Brown and Grizzly bears. Regulations dealing with all other species of game will be taken up at the next regular spring meeting.

The law requires that the proposals be consolidated, advertised, and widely distributed at least thirty (30) days before the Board meets so that the public may offer comments on them; therefore, the deadline October 4 has been set in conformity with the statutory requirements.

The proposed changes in regulations should be as specific as possible. Justifications for changes should accompany the proposals. The proposal should state exactly what locality, area, region is referred to, or indicate proposal is for Alaska as a whole. Whenever possible, the particular section for which change is sought should be cited, such as "109.06, Weekly fishing period."
