

UA Visitation Team

A program on the University of Alaska presented at Nome, Nenana, and Covenant High Schools during the week of Nov. 10 by a university faculty mem-

ber and two students.

Dr. William J. Loyens, an associate professor of anthropology at the University of Alaska, led the visitation team. Loyens was born in Belgium, but came to the United States in 1950.

The student members of the team were Colleen Herning, a junior journalism major and Harold Napoleon, a sophomore history major. Miss Herning, who graduated from Lathrop High School in Fairbanks, was elected to SPURS, a sophomore women's honorary organization. She is also active in dormitory government and is a reporter for the student newspaper.

Napoleon, who graduated from St. Mary's High School, is an officer in Alpha Phi Omega, a service fraternity. He was also president of his pledge class.

The representatives presented an informative program about the university and showed slides of the campus. They took along brochures about the university and its programs to distribute at each high school. They met with small groups and interested students to discuss specific programs.

This is the third year the university has sent out visitation teams to Alaskan high schools. This year eight faculty members and 19 students are participating. They visited 33 Alaskan High Schools with additional trips to Chemawa High School in Salem, Ore. and Whitehorse High School in British Columbia.
