

Law School Accepts Rep. Bill Hensley

William L. Hensley, a member of the State Legislature in Alaska, has been accepted as a student in a scholarship program in law at the University of New Mexico Law School.

Only 19 students — all American Indians or Eskimos — were accepted in this eight-week summer session program. Purpose of the program is to introduce the students to the study of law.

Hensley, who is 26 years old and single, is an Eskimo a resident of Kotzebue, Alaska.

He has attended the University of Alaska for two years and then transferred to George Washington University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in government. He maintained an excellent grade point average in all his undergraduate work. Now he is studying in

the sun-drenched American Southwest in legal matters.

Hensley, a member of the Alaska Legislature, is not certain whether he wants to pursue a legal education. If he decides to begin law in the fall, he will have to resign from the legislature.

He has been active in advancing the rights of Indians, not only as a legislator, but also by attempting to litigate land disputes in Alaska.

In the scholarship program, the students have studied introduction to the legislative process, introduction to Indian law, personal property, and legal writing.
