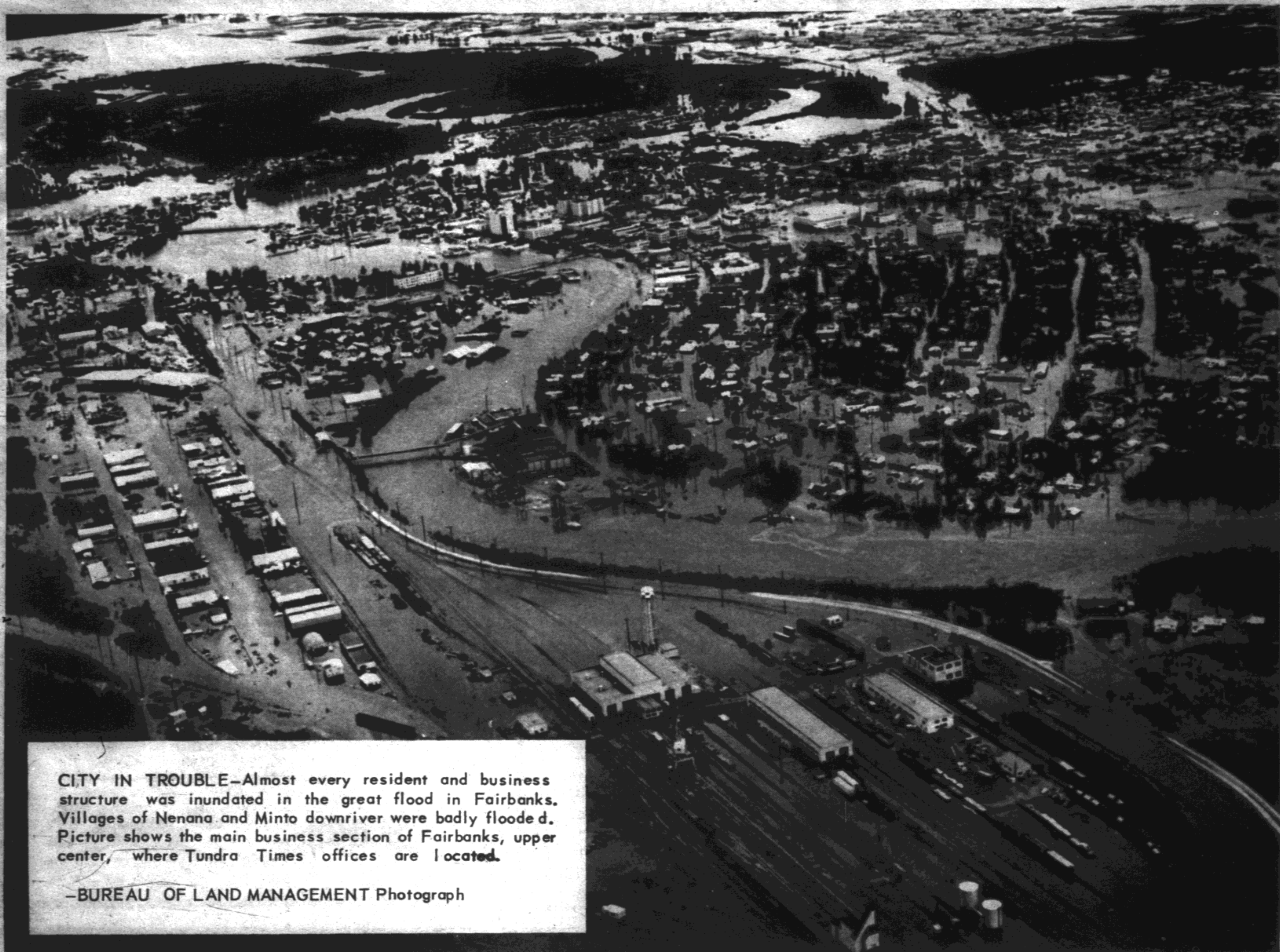
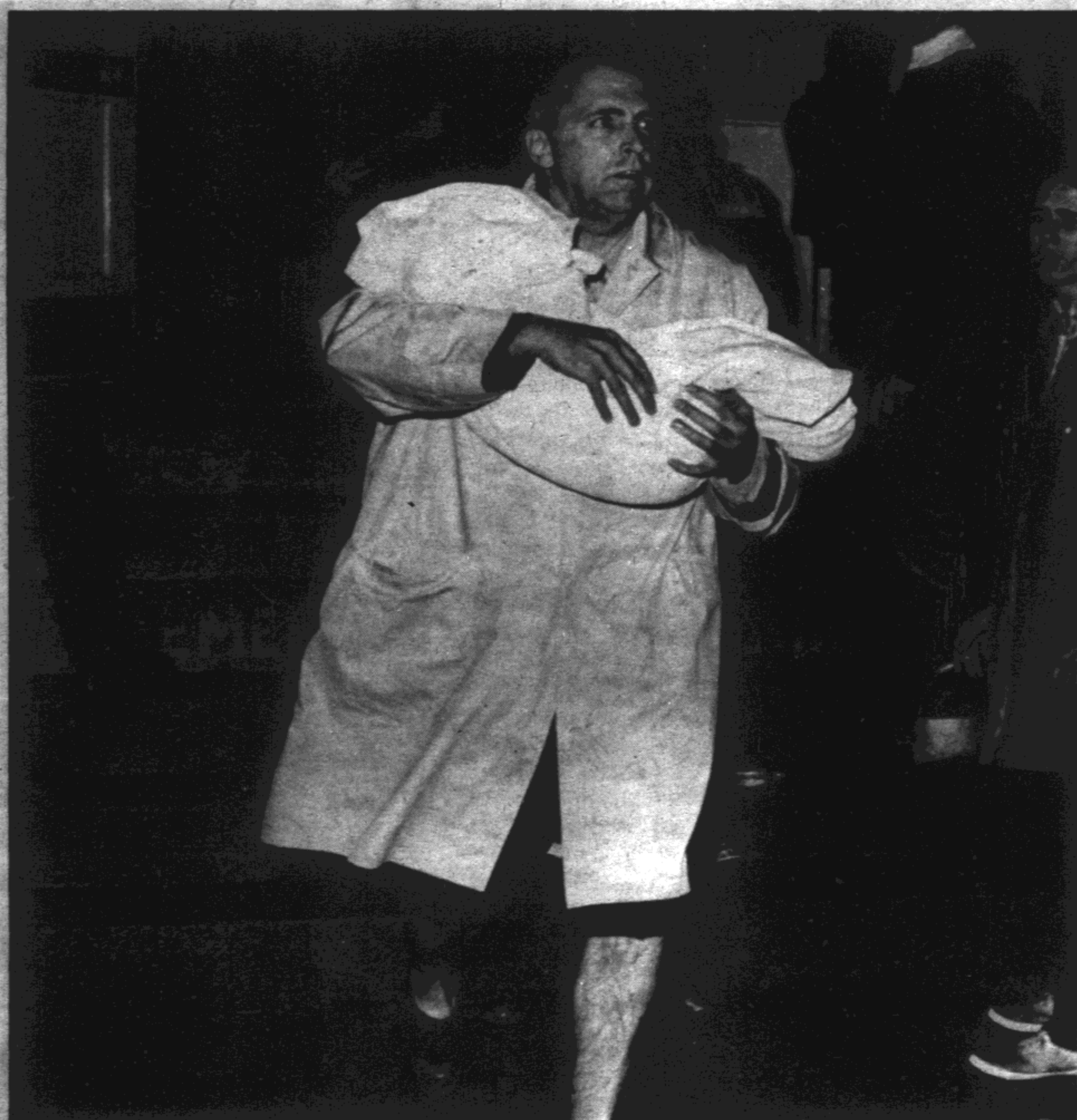


GREAT AUGUST 14 FLOOD STUNNED FAIRBANKS
