

# Company Donates Truck

A 10 yard GMC dump truck was recently donated by the Carrington Company of Anchorage to the Rural Alaska Community Action Program.

The truck, in turn, is being shipped to Old Harbor, Alaska to assist the Community Enterprise Development Corporation (CEDC) in their construction of a fish processing plant.

The truck was reconditioned at the Alaska Skill Center in Seward and delivered to the dock at Anchorage for shipment to Old Harbor. Along with the truck, a front-end loader owned by CEDC was also sent.

"They will be here for at least one year - July to July - and we certainly hope that they will consider staying a second year as VISTA Volunteers with the regional corporations, in order to increase their effectiveness," stated Irvin.

"We were really pleased with the quality of the Volunteers, their enthusiasm, and their intelligence. I, personally, think they are a cut above the quality of most VISTA's I have seen in the past. I will predict they will work out very well in the bush.
