Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment, and performing all work on Project S-0650 (13), Chena Hot Springs Road, Mile 55 to Chena Hot Springs, described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, September 2, 1971 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading and drainage of 1.7 miles of new roadway and construction of a 106' composite steel girder bridge with a roadway width of 28'-7" across the North Fork Chena River.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 22,400 cubic yards of Unclassified Excavation; 136,500 tons of Borrow; 11,100 tons of Subbase, Grading A; 8,725 tons of Class II Riprap; Class A Concrete, lump sum, all required; 334 linear feet of Structural Steel Piles; Structural Steel, lump sum, all required; and miscellaneous items of work.

All work shall be completed in 230 calendar days.

Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment and performing all work on Project AA-0627(1), Harding Lake Road, described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, September 2, 1971 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading and drainage of 5.2 miles of roadway, and surfacing alternatives of bituminous surface treatment and slurry seal. The project is located approximately 43 miles southerly of Fairbanks, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 17,500 cubic yards of Borrow; 11,000 tons of Crushed Aggregate Base; 306 linear feet of 24" Pipe Conduit; Surfacing Alternative "A" consists of 55 tons of MC-30, 173 tons of RC-800, and 1,873 tons of Cover Aggregates; Alternative "B" consists of 158 tons of QS-1 Emulsion and 1,700 tons of Aggregate, camp facilities shall be furnished by the Contractor to approximately 8 State employees; and miscellaneous items of work.
