Tony Schuerch has joined the
staff of the Division of Vocational
and Adult Education as Adult
Basic Education VISTA Supervisor,
Commissioner of Education
Marshall L. Lind announced today.

Mr. Schuerch, an Eskimo
from Kiana, traveled to Willamina,
Oregon to complete his high school
education. Following graduation, he
attended the University of Alaska
prior to beginning his military service
in the U.S. Army.

"Tony Schuerch brings to our
Department a sound background in
business and in education, as well
as a good knowledge of rural Alaska
and the Alaska Native," Commissioner
Lind stated. "He is a much needed
and welcomed addition to our adult
education staff."

For the past two years, Mr.
Schuerch has been an active member
of the Alaska Native Brotherhood
Education Committee.

A recent proposal of that
committee, now being initiated in
the Juneau schools, recommended
the hiring of a Native home-school
coordinator to work directly with
students and their parents in an
attempt to cut down the Native
student drop out rate.

The new ABE VISTA supervisor
will work with village councils

and VISTA volunteers statewide
to develop and expand adult
basic education courses.

He will coordinate conferences
and special projects and conduct
inservice administrative training
for adult educators. Currently,
85 adult basic education programs,
with 109 teachers, serve more than
2,000 adults in Alaska.

Schuerch said, "I learned many
of the concepts so basic to adult
education in this state while in
business, particularly as a salesman
here in Alaska for Pitney-Bowes.
There is an important relationship
between self-image and learning
ability. Success experiences alone
can improve a person's self-image."
