Gambell asks for State Trooper

The following is a resolution passed recently by the village of Gambell. The resolution is selfexplanatory, and is reprinted here for the information of our readers.

RESOLUTION 80-1

Be it known that the duly elected officers and members of the IRA Council City Council and the Gambell Native Corporation met on October 15, 1980; and

WHEREAS, alcohol abuse was discussed; and

WHEREAS, the use of alcohol has gotten out of control and resulted in the disturbance of the elementary school and its temporary closure; and

WHEREAS, the elementary school teachers were threatened at their residence and were directed to leave the village for their safety; and

WHEREAS, everyday violence is becoming rampant due to alcohol in which shooting incidents are occuring more often; and

WHEREAS, as a result of alcohol, our village social life is rapidly deteriorating; and

WHEREAS, our children's sense of ideals and education has directly and in long range terms become affected; and

WHEREAS, we still live under the influence of traditional values, the transition from the social morals, which prevent us from effectively enforcing alcohol related problems; and

WHEREAS. in places where sale of alcohol is legal, the tax revenue is effectively utilized for public safety enforcement; and

WHEREAS, this kind of revenue is non-existent in this village in which a majority of our economy'is from welfare; and

WHEREAS, in this joint meeting, the village governing bodies recognized these problems and the immediate need for financial and Department of Public Safety assistance for the enforcement of the city ordinances

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the State and Federal Agencies concerned, give immediate attention for financial assistance to the Village of Gambell; and

FURTHER, be it resolved that the State Department of Public Safety assign a State Trooper in Gambell to assist in the enforcement procedures.

CERTIFICATION

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Tribal Government of Gambell in a special meeting on the 15th day of October, 1980 by a vote of 28 for and 0 against.
