400 Alaska Veterans Now Go to College

Approximately 400 veterans, in Alaska, who are now attending college under the Veteran's G.I. Bill, are reminded by M.W. Mc-Donaugh, Manager, U.S. Veterans Administration for Alaska, that many enrollments have been for one semester only.

Veterans enrolled for only one semester must be re-enrolled for the following semester before training allowance payments for that period can commence. Also, those enrolled for only the first semester must furnish a Certificate of Attendance for the first semester before payment can commence for the second semester.

Certificates of Attendance have been automatically furnished to most veterans enrolled for only the first semester, McDonaugh stated.

Veterans are also reminded that if their enrollment in college was for an entire school year, they must notify the Veterans Administration immediately if they do not enroll for the second semester.

Failure to notify the Veterans Administration of non-enroll-ment for the second semester may result in overpayments which must be recovered.
