

Seward Stamp

Out March 30

A stamp honoring former Secretary of State William Seward had the acquisition of Alaska from Russia will be issued in Sitka March 30.

The vertical eight-cent Air Mail stamp reproduces an Indian totem. It is a line drawing in white against a bark brown background.

This is the second Commemorative Stamp honoring Seward. In 1909, on the occasion of the Alaska Yukon Exposition at Seattle, a stamp was issued to honor the significance of Seward's achievement in negotiating the Purchase of Alaska.

The cost of the First Day Covers is: one, cancelled, \$.35; three, cancelled, \$1.00; one, with two stamps, cancelled, \$.50; one, block of four stamps, \$.80; one, plate block, \$1.65.
