

Senate Passes Pre-Registration

Legislation requiring voters to pre-register in Alaska, starting with the 1968 primary election, has passed the State Senate.

A companion bill, calling for a poll of the voters in the general election of 1968 on whether they prefer a system of pre-registration, also passed.

Under the pre-registration measure, persons qualified to vote would have to pre-register prior to the primary and general elections of 1968.

The 1966 voters would be automatically registered, but would have to complete forms at the time they cast ballots in the 1968 elections.
