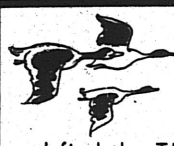

Vincent Price to Help Judge Alaska 67 Art Exhibition Pieces

FAIRBANKS, ALASKA--Actor and art critic Vincent Price will travel here in late March to join a panel which will judge the Alaska 67 Centennial Art Exhibit.

Other judges arriving here with Price will be Irwin Caplan, artist and syndicated cartoonist; Dr. Harold McCracken, director of the Whitney Gallery of Western Art; Ray Atkeson, calendar and magazine photographer; and Philip Hyde, Sierra Club photographer.

Mrs. Geneva Emmal, Alaska 67 vice president for the performing and creative arts, announced the jury last week. She said entries for the exhibit will be accepted until March 15 and that jurying will be held the next week.

The exhibit is being sponsored by the Alaska 67

Centennial Exposition and the Alaska Association for the Arts. It will commemorate 100 years of art in Alaska and will be shown from May 27 through Sept. 30 in the Civic Center art gallery on the Alaska 67 site in Fairbanks.

Price, best known for his Hollywood movie career, has gained a reputation as one of the nation's leading authorities on art. In 1962, he began the Vincent Price Collection of original art works.

Caplan created the popular "Famous Last Words" cartoon for the Saturday Evening Post and now serves with an art firm in Seattle, Wash. He also is well-known for his paintings.

Since 1958, Dr. McCracken has directed the Whitney Gallery and Buffalo Bill His-

torical Center in Cody, Wyoming. He has published 27 books dealing with Alaskan Natives and wildlife.

Both Atkeson and Hyde are noted for their scenic photographs of Western United States. Atkeson lives in Portland, Oregon, and Hyde in San Francisco, California.

The art exhibit is open to artists who have lived in Alaska one year or more. Work of artists no longer living in Alaska may be loaned by owners.

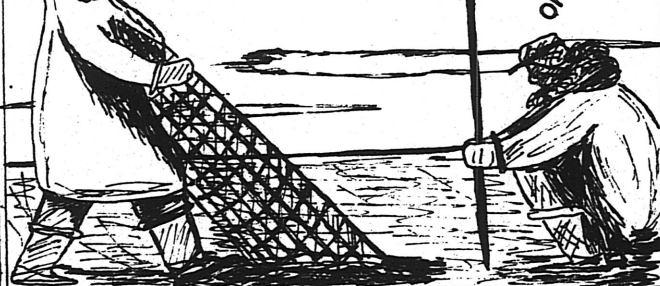

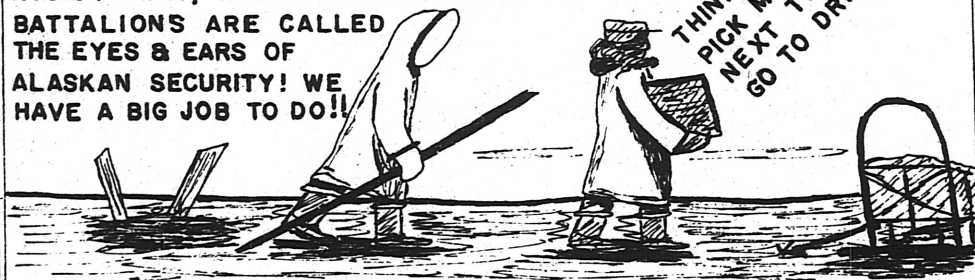
