

Indian Education Hearing in Alaska Postponed Again

The Subcommittee on Indian Education has again postponed its field hearing in Alaska and it is now expected to be held sometime next spring.

Sen. Wayne Morse of Oregon, chairman of the subcommittee and who has been defeated in his bid for re-election, will not be able to make the trip which makes it necessary to reschedule the hearing.

"The subcommittee recognizes the importance of educational problems of the Alaskan trip vital," said Diana C. Middleton, subcommittee staff member.

The new date will be announced sometime in the near future.

"However, it is still important that we receive your formal statement and recommendations regarding the program and legislative needs for inclusion in this year's committee records and report which will be submitted to Congress in January," Diana Middleton stated.
