

BLM to Again Operate Youth Conservation Corps Camp

Richard H. LeDosquet, Fairbanks District Manager, announced that the Bureau of Land Management will again be operating a Youth Conservation Corps Camp at 60 mile Steese

Highway.

This is the second year that the BLM has operated a YCC camp. Last year's camp was highly successful with the appraised value of the conservat-

ion work projects completed by Fairbanks youth totaling over \$30,000.

A total of 22 young men and women between the ages of 15 and 18 will be selected for employment in the Youth Conservation Corps Program this year.

Participants will be selected upon their interest in conservation, work habits and a recommendation from the school counselor. Youth participants cannot have any record of anti-social behavior or drug use.

Youths will be selected from cross section of the community, including all ethnic, economic

and social backgrounds. All interested youths should obtain application blanks from their school counselor.

The application should be filled out to the best of their ability and returned to the counselor. YCC enrollees will be employed for a period of 8 weeks beginning June 11, 1973 and ending August 3, 1973.
