As required by AS 44.62.250, notice is given that the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission adopted on this date, as emergency regulations, 20 AAC 05.210, 20 AAC 05.220 and 20 AAC 05.240 which set out the fishery resource codes, gear codes and the schedule of annual fees for the 1980 fishing season. These emergency regulations allow the Commission to mail out application forms and begin collecting fees and issuing permits in a more timely manner than otherwise possible as the permanent regulations covering these sections are in the adoption process. By that process the Commission does intend to make these regulations permanent.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

Notice is given that the Alaska Public Utilities Commission, under authority vested by AS 42.05.151(a), a proposes to amend regulations in Chapters 48 and 52 of Title 3 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement, interpret, or make specific various sections in the Alaska Public Utilities Commission Act (AS 42.05), as follows:

- (1) Generally, the proposed changes correct spelling and typographical errors and improve grammatical construction throughout the regulations; as well as reorganize and renumber several provisions of the regulations;
- (2) Personal pronouns based on gender are deleted and replaced with pronouns neutral as to gender or appropriate nouns throughout the regulations;
- (3) Internal consistency of the regulation is improved by:

(A) Adding paragraphs (18) and (19) to 3AAC 48.275(d) classifying sewer utilities by annual gross operating revenues and requiring use of the NARUC Uniform System of Accounts for sewer public utilities comparable to those systems of account applicable to other public utilities subject to the Commission's regulations; sewer utilities with at least \$500,000 annual gross operating revenues would maintain records and accounts according to the Uniform System of Accounts for Class A & B Sewer Utilities; those with annual gross operating revenues of less than \$500,000 would maintain records and accounts according to the Uniform System of Accounts for Class C & D Sewer Utilities;

(B) Amending 3AAC 48.420(a)(1), adding paragraph (6) to 3 AAC 48.420(a), and amending 3 AAC 48.420(b) providing for maximum customer deposits for garbage and refuse, cable television and radio common carrier (e.g., radio paging, radio telephone or improved mobile telephone service) public utilities comparable to

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
