

# 500 Pounds of Salmon For Eskimo Olympics

At the end of the Eskimo Olympics July 27, the Olympics Committee and the Fairbanks Native Association will put on a huge salmon bake for the public.

Five hundred pounds of king salmon were made available by Tony Lewis of Bethel this week for the occasion. Lewis is sending

the whopping sea-food to the Fairbanks Native Association in care of Ralph Perdue, the past president of the group.

Earlier, Perdue had talked to Rep. Ray Christensen of the Kuskokwim district and later Perdue wired Tony Lewis to ship 500 pounds of salmon. During the last few days, the Eskimo fishermen of Bethel have been catching hundreds of the huge fish, many of them weighing over 45 pounds.

Tony Lewis is the owner of Tundra Shack at Bethel, a roadhouse with a fountain and restaurant. Lewis is also the president of Kuskokwim Valley Native Association.
