

Artists Invited To A-67 Exhibit

Alaskan artists are invited to display their work in the "A-67 Centennial Art Exhibit of Alaska," featuring 100 years of art in Alaska. The exhibit on May 27-September 10, 1967, will be the official and permanent Centennial exhibit hung at the Civic-Cultural Community Center in Bartlett Plaza on the A-67 site.

Artists who have lived in Alaska for one year or more are eligible to exhibit and are invited to search through their existing works for what they consider their finest creation, or to begin now to express an original idea in sculpture, painting, graphics, or silversmithing.

The Civic Center building will house a permanent art gallery to remain open after the centennial so that all visitors to Fairbanks in the future may have the opportunity to view original Alaskan art from all over the state.

A "Young People's Art Exhibit" section will be a special feature of the exhibit emphasizing the talent of youth in Alaska from first grade through high school.

Artists are urged to plan now to create an original idea in painting (all media), graphics (drawing, pastels and prints), sculpture (all media) or silversmithing, to become a part of the state's official centennial art exhibit.

A catalog will be published of all accepted entries listed. Exhibits must arrive in Fairbanks not later than April 1, 1967 but should not be mailed before November 1, 1966. Judging will be done in April.

A prospectus detailing instructions for entry will be ready for mailing in July.
