NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE ALASKA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Commerce, Alaska Transportation Commission, under authority vested by AS 42.07.141 (a) and (b), proposes to amend regulations in Title 3 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 42.07.121 and AS 02.05 as follows:

3 AAC 68.130 is amended to

read:

3 AAC 68.130. **INSURANCE, MINIMUM AMOUNTS.** (a) Each air carrier shall maintain in force adequate security for the protection of the public against damage and injury for which the carrier may be liable by reason of its operation as an air carrier. The minimum amounts of security required by this section are set forth in (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g) and (h) of this section.

3 AAC 68.130. **INSURANCE** minimum amounts. (a) Each air(b) The minimum amount of security for bodily injury to or death of aircraft passengers shall be:

(1) \$75,000 for each passenger, and

(2) for each occurrence, an amount equal to the sum produced by multiplying \$75,000 by 75% of the total number of passenger seats installed in the aircraft.

(c) The minimum amount of security for bodily injury to or death of persons other than passengers shall be:

(1) \$75,000 for each person in any one occurrence, and

(2) for each occurrence, at least \$3000,000.

(d) The minimum amount of security for loss of or damage to property shall be \$10,000 for each occurrence.

(e) The minimum amount of liability coverage maintained by an air carrier who restricts his operations in air transportation to the carriage of mail or property, or both, shall be the amount specified in (c) and (d) of this section.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e) of this section, an air carrier may be insured for a single limit of liability for each occurrence. In that event, coverage shall be equal to or greater than the combined required minimums for bodily injury, property damage, and/or passenger liability for the type of use to which such aircraft is put, as the case may be. For example, the minimum single limit of liability acceptable for an aircraft in passenger service with sixteen passenger seats would be computed on the basis of limits set forth in (b) of this section, by multiplying 16 x .75 and the product multiplied by \$75,000, which would equal \$900,000. Nine hundred thousand dollars would then be added to \$300,000 (non-passenger liability occurrence under (c) of this section), plus \$10,000 (property damage per occurrence under (d) of this section) equals \$1,300,000 which is the amount required of a single liability policy in this example under this section.

(g) In the case of a single limit of liability, aircraft may be insured by a combination of primary and excess policies. Such policies shall have combined coverage equal to or greater than the required minimums for bodily injury to non-passengers, property damage, and/or passenger liability for the type of use to which the aircraft is put, as the case may be.

(h) The minimum amount of liability for loss of or damage to cargo while carried on or resting in any one conveyance or premises shall be \$10,000 per conveyance or premises for any one loss, and shall be at least \$20,000 for loss or damage in each occurrence. Conveyance includes but is not limited to, aircraft, motor vehicles, rail and watercraft.

Notice is also given that any person interested may present oral or written statements or arguments relevant to the action proposed or may appear at a hearing to be held in the Alaska Transportation Commission's Hearing Room, 338 Denali Street, 10th Floor MacKay Building, Anchorage, Alaska 99501 at 9:30 a.m. on January 18th, 1977.
