State tax forms are late

Alaska's state income tax forms will be late this year because the Department of Revenue was late in getting the forms printed.

The booklets should be in the mail to taxpayers about January 15, two weeks behind schedule according to Sterling Gallagher,

Commissioner of Revenue.

"We wish to remind taxpayers that a copy of their Federal return must be attached to their Alaskan resident long form or part-year nonresident returns," said Gallagher. "So if you file your U.S. return before filing your Alaskan return, be sure to keep a copy of your U.S. return."
