

University of Alaska seeks comment on Draft Plan through statewide audioconference, April 4

The University of Alaska system is holding a statewide audioconference hearing, April 4, to receive public comment and recommendations regarding its recently distributed draft of a six-year plan, developed over the last year by a system-wide committee. The plan outlines priorities to be addressed across the university system through 1992.

At Soldotna, Sitka, Kodiak, Palmer, Valdez, Delta, Homer, Dillingham, Unalaska, Ft. Yukon, McGrath, Nenana, St. Paul, and Petersburg, the hearing will be from 12:30 to 3:30.

At Kotzebue, Ketchikan, Bethel, Nome, Barrow, Adak, Seward, Tok, Galena, King Cove, Naknek, Sand Point and Cordova the hearing will be from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m.

At Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau, the hearings will be from 12:30 to 3:30 and 4:00 to 7:00 p.m.

The Conference will be hosted by University of Alaska programs in each community. It will be chaired by Dr.

Donald Behrend, provost of the university system. The public is invited to participate.
