Division of Governmental Coordination Alaska Coastal Management Program March 17, 1986

On October 30, 1985, the Alaska Coastal Policy Council amended the Alaska Coastal Management Program regulations in Title 6 of the Alaska Administrative Code dealing with the designation of areas which merit special attention (AMSA). Article 4 of 6 AAC 80 has been changed to make requirements for AMSAs inside coastal districts more consistent with requirements for AMSAs outside coastal districts. Minor editorial changes were also made for the sake of clarity and brevity.

This change has been approved by the federal Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management, as provided in 15 CFR 923.84. Notice of the federal review was given on December 16, 1985,

The regulations were filed with the Lieutenant Governor on March 3, 1986, and will go into effect on April 2, 1986.

THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA COMMISSION ON POSTSECONDARY **EDUCATION**

Notice is given that the Alaska Commission on Postsecondry Education, under authority vested by AS 14.43.105, proposes to amend and adopt regulations in Title 20 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the Scholarship Loan Program, to implement AS 14.43.105, as follows:

20 AAC 15.900(b)(3)(C) is repealed and readopted to define the term "full-time" student for those enrolled in a non-flight school career education program as a student enrolled for at least 30 clock hours per week, a clock hour being a period of time which is equivalent of: (i) a 50 to 60 minute class. lecture, or recitation; or (ii) two hours of outside preparation related to the activities in (i) of this subparagraph, for up to a maximum of ten such preparation hours per week.

20 AAC 15.900(b)(3) is also amended by adding a new paragraph (D) to define the term "full-time" student for those enrolled in an approved flight school program as a student who logs a minimum of 40 hours per month, including pre- and postflight instruction and ground school hours, or averaged 80 hours for a two-month period.
