

WW II Vets Have 3 Mo. for Loans

Approximately 3 months remain for veterans of World War II to use their privileges for a VA loan to purchase a home. This warning came from H. C. Christie, Manager of the Juneau Veterans Administration Regional Office.

Present statutes provide that the absolute cutoff date for World War II veterans will be on July 25, 1967. This deadline is the result of Congressional action which has delayed the final date of eligibility several times.

The cutoff will not affect veterans of the Korean Conflict or veterans who have served since January 31, 1955, Christie pointed out, as these veterans are covered by different legislation.

Direct loans up to \$17,500 are available in Alaska by eligible veterans for the construction, remodeling or purchase of homes.

Christie urged World War II veterans interested in obtaining a loan through the VA to contact the VA Office, Federal Building, P.O. Box 1399, Anchorage, or the VA Regional Office, Federal Building, P.O. Box 1288, Juneau, as soon as possible.
