On April 2, 1975, Doyon, Limited, filed selection application AA-8103-S, as amended, under the provisions of Sec. 12(c) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of December 18, 1971 (43 U.S.C. 1601, 1611(c) (1976)) (ANCSA), as amended, for the surface and subsurface estates of certain lands withdrawn pursuant to Sec. 11(a)(1) for the Native village of Shageluk. The application excluded a large unnamed lake in T. 28 N., R. 56 W., Seward Meridian, as being navigable. As this is considered nonnavigable and as Sec. 12(c)(3) and 43 CFR 2652.3(c) require the region to select all available lands within the township, the bed of this water body is considered selected.

As to the lands described below, the application, as amended, is properly filed and meets the requirements of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act, as amended, and of the regulations issued pursuant thereto. These lands do not include any lawful entry perfected under or being maintained in compliance with laws leading to acquisition of title.

All easements are subject to applicable Federal, State, or Municipal corporation regulation. The following is a listing of uses allowed for each type of easement. Any uses which are not specifically listed are prohibited.

25 Foot Trail - The uses allowed on a twenty-five (25) foot wide trail easement are: travel by foot, dog sled, animals, snowmobiles, two- and three-wheel vehicles, and small all-terrain vehicles (less than 3,000 lbs. Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW)).

a. (EIN 3 C3, D1, D9) An easement for an existing access trail twenty-five (25) feet in width from Anvik to Shageluk and on east to public land. The uses allowed are those listed above for a twenty-five foot wide trail easement. The season of use will be limited to winter.
