Tomorrow, it has been announced.

In addition to receiving a specially designed silver charm from General Mills, sponsor of the annual homemaking education program, Martha Evon, is now eligible for one of 102 college scholarships totaling \$110,000.

Martha is an Eskimo and daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Evon of Bethel, Alaska. She has been a Home Economics student at Chilocco for four years.

From school winners in the State, a State Homemaker of Tomorrow and runner-up will be selected within the next few weeks. The state winner will be awarded a \$1,500 scholarship and the runner-up a \$500 educational grant.

In addition, the school of the Homemaker of Tomorrow will receive a complete set of Encyclopedia Britannica from Encyclopaedia Britannica, Inc.

This spring, the 51 Home-makers of Tomorrow representing every state and the District of Columbia, each accompanied by a school advisor, will join for an expense-paid educational tour of Washington, D.C., and Colonial Williamsburg, Va.

Climax of the tour will be announcement of the 1970 Betty Crocker All-American Homemaker of Tomorrow.

Selected from the 51 finalists on the basis of original test scores and personal observation and interviews during the tour, she will be awarded an increase in her scholarship to \$5,000. Se-

cond, third and fourth ranking Homemakers of Tomorrow in the nation will also be chosen, and will receive scholarship increases to \$4,000, \$3,000 and \$2,000 respectively.

Begun by General Mills in the 1954-55 school year to emphasize the importance of homemaking as a career, the Betty Crocker Search is the only national undergraduate scholarship program exclusively for high school senior girls.

During its 16-year history, more than seven million young women have participated in the program and scholarship awards, with this year's grants, will total over \$1,700,000.

A record 646,041 senior girls in 15,040 of the country's high schools were enrolled in this year's Search.
