

Frank Berry To Head Cross-Cultural Education Program

FAIRBANKS — Tlingit educator Franklin L. Berry has been named director of the \$250,000 project in cross-cultural education recently announced by Senator Ted Stevens.

The project has been named the Alaskan Educational Program for Intercultural Communication and is funded by the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare through the University of Alaska's Center for the Northern Educational Research.

It will provide assistance to

school districts throughout the state to improve education for students of all ethnic backgrounds.

This past year, as associate director of a CNER project to increase community involvement in the schools, Berry organized workshops in Sitka, Bethel, Kodiak, Copper Center and Nome.

School administrators, teachers, students, board members, and parents met together to discuss school problems occurring between ethnic groups, and

ways in which schools and communities can better meet the needs of all students.

The Alaskan Educational Program for Intercultural Communication will continue this type of workshop. It will also provide technical assistance to train school boards in meeting problems related to ethnic differences.

Specialists will be available to develop curricula which will serve to increase understanding between Alaskan ethnic groups.

In addition, in-service teacher training sessions will be provided

by staff members, and a pilot project in student counselling will be developed.

AEPIC staff members presently include Joe Senungetuk, artist and author of "Give or Take a Century"; Vivian Moore program innovator and writer; Kay Hinckley, teacher and counselor, 1973 winner of the Associated Students Award for Outstanding Contributions to Students; and Ron Inouye, sociologist studying and teaching about inter-ethnic relationships in Alaska.
