ers, students, board members, and parents met together to discuss school problems occurring between ethnic groups, and

ways in which schools and communities can better meet the needs of all students

The Alaskan Educational Program for Intercultural Communication will continue this type of workshop. It will also provide technical assistance to train school boards in meeting pro-blems related to ethnic differ-

Specialists will be available to develop curricula which will serve to increase understanding between Alaskan ethnic groups.

In addition, in-service teacher training sessions will be provided by staff members, and a pilot project in student counselling will be developed.
