

Gov. Wants \$150,000 For Winter Games

WASHINGTON — Alaska Gov. William Egan urged a U.S. House Commerce subcommittee Monday to appropriate \$150,000 for the third biennial Arctic Winter Games, planned for March, 1974 in Anchorage. Egan and others told the

subcommittee the games are needed by residents of the Far North, who are short of opportunities for athletic competition.

Egan noted that the games would include badminton, basketball, hockey and Native Alaskan sports, including the blanket toss and ear weight competition.
