

Most Popular Cabinet Member—

American People Having Love Affair with Kissinger

The American people are having a love affair with Secretary of State Henry Alfred Kissinger, according to a Harris Poll. It found him "the most popular member ever" of the Federal

Government's Executive Branch by 88 to 5 per cent, crediting him as a "highly skilled negotiator."

In honor of Doctor Kissinger, the first ERRINNOPHILIE

stamp bloc offered for sale in the United States to collectors of Errinnophilie is a special limited edition, not for postal use (United States Law forbids us to place a living person on a stamp).

This Commemorative two bloc set (one perforated and one imperforated) of four stamps each, in six colour, offset print, has been released from Holland.

The price per two bloc set is \$25, checks payable to October GG. Productions, Inc., with orders mailed to Unit 100, Catalysts Unlimited, 250 West 57 Street, Suite 2012, New York 10019. Orders are filled on a "postmarked first come" basis. Clearly state the number of sets wanted, as well as name and return address.

UNICEF, the United Nations division concerned with underprivileged children throughout the world, is earmarked for 20% of the proceeds.

These blocs depict Doctor

Kissinger in bold relief against maps of world trouble spots he mediated as peacemaker, and Sweden, where he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

They are printed by the State Printery of Jon Enschede en Zonen Grafische Inrichting D.V., Haarlem, Holland, designed by the eminent Dutch stamp artist Piet Wetselaar, with a warranted maximum run of only two hundred fifty thousand bloc sets worldwide.

Errinnophilie stamp blocs are not for postal use and are edited with permission of postal authorities. They are printed by specialized printers of currency and government documents. To safeguard collectors the plates are destroyed under legal supervision.

These issues are much sought after in Belgium, England, Germany, Holland and other European countries and the Kissinger issues is in the Cardinal Spellman Philatelic Museum. Knowledge-

able American collectors are now into Errinnophilie due to the high incidence of international travel.

Vic Kassery of Catalyst Unlimited says "lexicographers and dictionaries here do not contain this Flemish word. It derives from the Dutch word 'herinnering' (remembrance).

As Errinnophilie blocs issued in the past have always enhanced in value, this Kissinger issue should increase its worth sharply when the plates are destroyed, thus protecting the collectors' investment."
