Appointment to the position will be made by the Tribal Council. The Administrative Director will coordinate the activities of the Tribal Council and its eight standing committees and will be responsible for administering the 500 employee tribal organization. The Administrative Director develops and administers the annual tribal budget, complete with performance review; interprets and applies the financial and personnel policies and procedures across all tribal programs and recommends additional policy initiatives for consideration by tribal council and the standing committees. Applicants should have a minimum of a bachelor's degree in business administration, public administration or a related field. Favorable consideration will be given to applicants having management experience with federal, state, local or tribal governments or business organizations. Applicants must have had experience in organization development, team building, and financial management. Candidates will be rated on a point system according to their qualifications.
