

Misquotation Hurts

A MISQUOTATION in a recent New York Times story on the American Indian Community House un-did whatever good it might have accomplished in terms of understanding, says Secretary Miffie Hines, because it drove an artificial wedge among the Indians living in the city.

The article erroneously stated the organization excluded any Indians who were not full-blood from its programs and activities.

"That error is actually not as horrendous as the totally inaccurate one under the small headline," said Miffie. It read: "10,000 Indians in the city try not to feel isolated."
