NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES
IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE
ALASKA STATE COMMISSION
FOR HUMAN RIGHTS

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights, under authority vested by A.S. 18.80.050, proposes to repeal and adopt regulations in Title 6 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement A.S. 18.80 et seq., as follows:

1. Title 6 Chapter 30 of the Alaska Administrative Code is repealed.

2. New provisions are adopted in Title 6, Chapter 30 as follows:

Article 1. (6 AAC 30.011 - 6 AAC 30.041) INQUIRIES. These regulations describe what the Commission's staff does with inquiries made before complaints are filed.

Article 2. (6 AAC 30.210 - 6 AAC 30.230) COMPLAINTS. These regulations set standards and procedures for filing complaints by individuals and by the Executive Director.

Article 3. (6 AAC 30.310 - 6 AAC 30.370) IMPARTIAL INVESTIGATION, DETERMINATION AND CONCILIATION. These regulations describe how the Commission's staff conducts an impartial investigation of a complaint, including the use of a conference designed to resolve it as promptly as possible. Other provisions in this article describe the staff's investigative methods, how it makes its determination, and how it determines how parties involved in a hearing are satisfied. These provisions include the use of hearing exemptions. Class action procedures are included. The regulations describe each step of the hearing process and show how orders are entered both on the merits of a case and on assessment of costs and attorney fees.

Article 5. HEARING DISCOVERY. These regulations are administrative revisions of the rules of procedure used in civil cases in Alaska's courts and define how parties involved in a hearing before the Commission exchange information as a case is being prepared for
