Articles 5 and 6 are reserved for future use.

**Article 8: REPORTS AND RECORDKEEPING**  
These regulations describe the reports required to be kept by employers, employment agencies and labor organizations, and how long the records must be retained. Another regulation describes what the Commission staff does with employment records it gathers for its studies.

**Article 9: GENERAL PROVISIONS.** These regulations define the substantive standards by which the Commission decides cases and certain provisions for future use. Superior Court issuance of subpoenas, reopening cases, publicizing case results, cooperating with local commissions, and general provisions concerning the availability, construction and validity of regulations. Definitions of key words and phrases in the Human Rights Law and the regulations are included.
