

Anderson and Gardner in showdown for House speaker

JUNEAU Sen. John (Sacket (R-Galena) and Sen Frank Ferguson (D-Kotze bue) have announced that their priorities for the Eleventh Alaska Legislature are education and jobs in rural Alaska.

Sackett has been appoin ted to serve a second session as Chairman of the power ful Senate Finance Committee. Senator Ferguson recently reelected to his se cond term, has been appoin ted as Chairman of the Senate Labor and Management Committee and as Vice Chairman of the Senate Helath, Education and So cial Services Committee

In order to achieve the priorities, Sackett and Ferguson said they are consid ering the possibility of using taz incentives to encourage the growth of private enterprise while promoting more jobs for rural Alaskans.

Both senators say they plan to work closely with Sen. Bill Sumner (R-Anchorage). Chairman of the Senate I iployment Opportunities Committee and the Senate Resources Commit

Senators Sackett and Ferguson say they are confident that funds available will be used to the best benfit of all Alaskans and will once again ensure that the much needed bush priorities will be given the emphasis they want.

At press time, the House of Representatives has still not yet organized its leadership. An apparent show down is developing for the top post of Speaker between Rep. Nels Anderson, Jr. (D-Dillinghara) and Rep Terry Gardner (D-Ketch)
