

# Aloysius leads Edgumbe in scoring

Bonnie Aloysius, Mt. Edgumbe's sparkling senior guard, moved into the top position on the career scoring list for the Bravettes. She surpassed the old mark in the team's ninth game, against Hoonah, and now has collected a total of 865 tallies with several games remaining. She is the daughter of Alec and Ketrina Aloysius of Kals-

kag.

Aloysius' total reflects her consistency through her four years as a starter on the Edgumbe team. She has been named to the coaches' Southeast Alaska All-tournament team for three years and last winter

played on the Alaska Junior Women's basketball team which took the championship at the Arctic Winter Games in Hay River, Northwest Territories, Canada. As a sophomore, Bonnie was named the Most Inspirational Bravette by her

teammates and last year was voted the Most Valuable Player award.

Aloysius replaced Lillian Lane of Pt. Hope as the top scorer. Lane was a standout for Mt. Edgumbe from 1971 to 1975. During her career, she scored 777 points in 48 games, and still is the record-holder for scoring

average with 16.3 points per game. Three times Lane was named as the Most Valuable Female Athlete at Edgumbe, and because of her contribution to the total athletic program, the coaches still present that award in her honor. Aloysius was the recipient of the Lillian Lane Award last year.
