Upper Yukon Manpower
Resources Surveyed

"Alaska's Manpower Resources—The Upper Yukon," a report on manpower resources in 10 small northern communities is now available for distribution.

The booklet presents the results of a survey made under the Smaller Communities Program last winter in Arctic, Village, Beaver, Birch Creek, Chalkyitsik, Circle, Eagle, Fort Yukon, Kakotvik, Stevens Village and Venetie.

These villages were selected for study because of their proximity to the proposed route of the Trans Alaska Pipeline, possible seismic explorations in their area and the high rate of unemployment among their residents.

This is the fifth Smaller Communities Program report on the State's manpower resources in rural communities.

Previous studies have covered Bristol Bay, Kotzebue, Barrow and East Central Alaska.
