## Display 'salutes' Alaska Guard

So far Army and Air Guard officials report that their recruiting and retention efforts are about on target. Still, they express concern in "getting the word out."

This year's "salute" to the armed forces has far greater interest to Alaska Army and Air Guard representatives. They say they're excited about this opportunity to discuss their growth.
