ANHS Appoints Gerald Ivey

Mr. Gerald Ivey has been appointed irector of the Alaska Area Native Health Service according to an announcement by Dr. Emery Johnson, Director of the Indian Health Service in Washington, D.C.

Mr. Ivey succeeds Dr. John Lee who recently retired. A native Alaskan of Athabascan descent,

Ivey is well known throughout the state. He has been active in native affairs for many years.

Past President of the Fairbanks Native Association, he has also been a board member of the Alaska Federation of Natives, the Tundra Times, Alaska Education Association, and served as president of the Fort Wainwright Education Association.

A former educator, Ivey joined the Alaska Native Area Health Services in 1969 as Native Affairs Officer, he later became Executive Officer.

As Director, Ivey will be responsible for the administration of the U.S. Public Health Service health program for approximately 50,000 Indian, Eskimo and Aleut people. He will

also administer local health facilities for Coast Guardsmen and American and Foreign Seamen.

The Alaska Area Native Health Service includes 6 Service Unit Hospitals and the Alaska Native Medical Center in Anchorage, and a number of smaller field medical facilities in native villages throughout the state.

The Federal medical complex employs nearly 1300 people.

He was educated at the Mt. Edgecumbe BIA School, later attended Washington State University, and Western Washington College of Education, Bellingham, Washington.

He received his Bachelor's and Master's Degree in Education at the University of Alaska in Fairbanks. In 1972 he obtained his Master's in Public Health Administration and Planning at the University of California, Berkeley, California.

Sta. Allowances For ANG Members

Alaska National Guard Members on active duty in Alaska will be given station allowances equivalent to those paid active duty members of the Armed Forces stationed in Alaska, under recent decisions by the General Accounting Office (GAO) and the Defense Department, U.S. Sen. Ted Stevens announced today.

Previously, this cost of living allowance was given only to members active duty for 20 weeks or more.

The allowance will be effective for both with-dependent and without-dependent rates as appropriate for each Guard member.

Stevens had written both the GAO and the Secretaries of the Armed Services to urge favorable consideration of the payment of the allowance.
