

Services held for Samuel Martin

Services were held last week for Samuel Martin, 66, who died July 7 in Cordova.

Mr. Martin was born in Juneau May 6, 1923, and graduated from Juneau High School.

He was of the Raven's Nest House (*Duk dan taan*) from Hoonah. He was a commercial fisherman in the Icy Straits area and later in Seward and Cordova.

Mr. Martin was a member of the Copper River Fisherman's Co-op, Cook Inlet Region Inc. and the Seldovia Village Corp. He worked in construction on both the Alcan Highway and the trans-Alaska Pipeline.

His parents, Scotty Martin and Jessie Wilson, preceeded him in death.

Survivors include aunts Sadie Campus of Wrangell and Ruth Dennis of Juneau; brothers Walter Martin of Mesa, Ariz., Joseph Wilson of Juneau, Albert Wilson of Sitka and Daniel Wilson of Juneau; sisters, Mamie Williams of Hoonah, Elizabeth Scarlett of Lenexa, Kan., and Lillian Collier of Oakland, Calif.; and numerous nieces and nephews.
