There have been new faces seen in our Senior Center here in Barrow. They are those of Alec and Elaine Frankson. We also had a visitor from Canada, her name was Alukaluk. We hope to see more new Seniors

here, and that they like to come so they will continue.

From the Center we give rides in the morning, and in the afternoon we serve the hot lunch to those who come in for a free meal, and we deliver lunches home to those who are disabled.

After lunch the Seniors have activities, like checkers, Pinochle Snerts, or they listen to radio or watch TV — or simply visit with each other. People 60 and over are invited to the Center, we are located on Main Street in the blue building across from Sam & Lee's Restaurant.
