tary Patricia Petrivelli, an Aleut living in Anchorage, is a researcher on Aleut history and culture for the Aleutian/Pribilof Islands Association. Mac Davis, Board Treasurer, owns and operates a business accounting service in Anchorage and previously served as Director of Technical Assistance for the Alaska Federation of Na-

tives. Marilyn Richards, Editor and Publisher, is an Iñupiat who is from Kotzebue and has an extensive background in journalism.

Other directors include Theresa "Tiny" Devlin, an Athabascan living in Anchorage who serves on the staff of the UAF Alaska Native Human Resources

Development Program; Thomas R. Drake, a retired North Slope Borough corrections officer and an Iñupiat originally from Nome; Arthur J. Lake, Superintendent of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Bethel Agency and a Yupik originally from Hooper Bay; Iliodor Philemonof, Vice President of St. George
