

# CAMPS to Train Native Residents

JUNEAU—Governor Keith H. Miller's plan for development of resources took another step forward last week when he called for coordination of manpower programs throughout the state at all levels of government and business.

"We have a committee called CAMPS - Cooperative Area Manpower Planning System," Miller said, "which includes representatives of all Federal/and State agencies having manpower program resources. The committee is not an agency in itself, it is an organization in which qualified spokesmen of individual agencies meet to ensure maximum coordination among the various human resource development and training programs."

The Governor pointed out that the CAMPS committee is currently studying the feasibility of establishing centers to develop the skills of those Alaskans in need of basic education, vocational training and special services to achieve employment.

"It is our desire to train Native Alaskans in Alaska rather than displace our Eskimos, Aleuts and Indians in training centers thousands of miles from their homes," Governor Miller said.

The Governor expressed the hope that through the efforts of CAMPS the coordination of all training programs of State and Federal Agencies will result in the common goal of Alaskans trained for Alaskan jobs.
