

Rader Campaigning in Kotzebue, Nome, Unalakleet, Other Villages

Keeping to the marathon proportions of his campaign travel schedule, John Rader, candidate for the United States House of Representatives, departed Fairbanks this morning on an intensive swing to the communities and villages of Northwestern Alaska.

Rader will visit Kotzebue, Nome, Unalakleet and surrounding villages.

Rader said, "The purpose of this trip is to get to the outlying communities of the state and to find out from those who live in frontier conditions what their needs and problems are....and then to develop meaningful legislation and dynamic programs which will meet the challenges."

Rader, who has already completed a marathon trip through most of the remote areas of the state, is proposing a massive Federal program which would be based on the precedent established by the Appalachia program.

Rader will return Saturday afternoon for campaign activities which have been scheduled

this weekend in the Cook Inlet Basin.
