Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, equipment and materials and performing all work on Project F-095-10(2) and F-095-10(3), Haines-Lutak Road, Ferry Terminal Paving and Haines-Canadian Border Safety Project, described herein, will be received until 11:00 a.m. prevailing time, June 11, 1968, in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project consists of grading, drainage and hot bituminous pavement on 4.3 miles of the Haines-Lutak Road. Included in this Project will be the paving of the Haines Ferry Terminal and installation of guard rail at various locations between Haines and the Canadian Border.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 16,600 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 8,200 tons of crushed aggregate base; 6,300 tons of hot bituminous pavement; 1,600 linear feet of 8" perforated pipe; 12,000 linear feet of beam type guard rail; and miscellaneous items of work including utility adjustments. All work shall be completed by November 15, 1968.
